Dear Parents/Guardians/Carers,



### Windrush 75

Yesterday in school, we reflected on the *75th Anniversary of the arrival of the HMT Empire Windrush at Tilbury Docks in Essex, before making its way on to London. This first voyage carried 800 people from the Caribbean who had been invited to the UK to help rebuild the nation following World War 2. However, once they arrived, the passengers were not usually greeted with the warm welcome they were expecting and many suffered racist abuse and were persecuted against in terms of the limited housing and employment they could access. Sometimes their qualifications were ignored so passengers who were pilots, doctors, nurses, accountants etc were refused similar jobs here and were only able to take on unskilled manual work. Many more voyages were made between 1948 and 1971 with the promise of a 'better life' and those people who migrated to the UK during that time under the British Nationality Act became known as the 'Windrush Generation'. Our learners will celebrate the diversity of culture which the Windrush Generation have brought to the UK, as well as reflecting on the hardship and discrimination that they have endured.*

We must never forget those who came before us and paved the way.


